



CMS Research Seminar: Surviving the Third Nuclear Age

Our nuclear world is as dangerous today as it has been for at least a generation. The nuclear-armed "great powers" appear increasingly locked in geopolitical competition as the world moves from a unipolar to a multipolar system. Rapid technological change is creating the potential for enhanced nuclear and non-nuclear strategic weapons with possible destabilising effects, while international norms and arms control are eroding.

Together with Professor of International Politics at the University of Leicester, Andrew Futter, we will discuss how these conditions lay the foundation for a new nuclear age, and what it will require to survive it.
