



Seminar: War and Progress? On the tension in liberal ideas about the legitimate use of force

What do debates about the legitimacy of force reveal about “progress” in world politics? Is using force to achieve progress viewed as possible or even desirable? In this talk, Emily Tannock offers a new theory on the relationship between ideas of progress and the legitimate use of force, by way of three ongoing debates about force. The norms that have evolved towards these ends shape, and are shaped by, contemporary conflicts, just as they are articulated in rules and institutions, including international law.

Emily Tannock is a Lecturer in War Studies at the Centre for Future Defence and National Security at Deakin University, Australia, based at the Australian War College.
